- Provide the rubrics for the essays so the students know what they are actually being graded on.
- I wish the course was organized a little better in Brightspace, some of the assignments and other course materials are hard to find sometimes. I don't think the packbacks are necessary, they are honestly a little bit of a waste of time. I think you could use the idea of packback questions as the layouts for recitations because they sometimes feel like they are grasping for something to do while we're in there. I also think if we're going to have a final exam then we should have exams throughout the year because I feel unprepared and I'm not sure what to expect for the final one and it's the only one I'll get.
- I would suggest making sure that there is a certain scale and rubric that all TA's follow when grading essays. I know my TA didnt even tell us the rubric she was basing her grading off of for the essay, and I know there were certain things I would have done differently with my essay if I would have had access to the rubric.
- I would give more time for the packback ( due on Sunday instead Friday), and then also at times in class I felt as if it was unclear to what was being said as there were pauses throughout the sentences.
- Make recitations a bit more structured. I like the open discussion aspect of it, however, structuring in a way that introduces why that discussion will help us apply the material we learned in class might be helpful. For example, have us give our take on the issue and then have us take X philosophers view and apply it to the same as it can help compare, contrast, understand, and remember different takes on the same issue rather than just our own.
